

Bailey Bridge

This innovative design of lightweight and easily erectable bridge was developed at the Experimental Bridging Establishment at Christchurch Barracks in Barrack Road by civil engineer Sir Donald Coleman Bailey OBE (1901-1985) during World War II.

The main advantages of this design were that the pre-fabricated sections were light enough to be erected manually and without the need for any special tools or equipment.

Field Marshal Montgomery later wrote that Bailey Bridges had made "an immense contribution towards ending World War II". General Eisenhower, Supreme Allied Commander of the forces in Europe, listed the Bailey Bridge along with radar and the heavy bomber as one of the three major inventions of the War.

The present bridge was donated by the Royal Armament Research and Development Establishment (Christchurch) in 1984 to replace an original prototype Bailey Bridge.
